

Eastwood Explorers

- A walk around Eastwood -

Start: at the library and look out for all these points of interest along your way!

Finish: at St Mary's Church

The numbers in purple match the numbers on the photos.

1. Leave the library, walk towards Heron and cross using the zebra crossing outside the Town Hall
2. Turn left and walk along the road, crossing carefully to pause at the war memorial at the top of Plumtree Way – look around for the **brick Phoenix**. Do you know the links to DH Lawrence?
3. Cross the other side of Plumtree way then cross back over the main road carefully.
4. Turn left then almost immediately right down Walker Street. Look out for the **chimney**. How is it unusual?
5. A little further down we come to **Three Tuns Road**. How do you think it got that name?
6. Carry on down Walker Street and look for a **blue information board**. Can you see what house it is talking about?
7. Just past here is a short path that leads down, to the right and back up onto Walker Street a little further down.
8. Carry on down Walker Street until it meets with Lynncroft then turn left and go down the hill, keeping an eye out for the **red post box**. What monarch was ruling when this box was erected – how do we know?
9. At the bottom of the hill, note the **seating area**. What shape is this area in?
10. Carefully cross the road and enter Beauvale playing fields. Can you find **The brook**? Can you see any wildlife around?
11. Go a little further in and look around for a very **colourful bin**. What do you think it looks like? Ice cream sprinkles?
12. Now look around once more – can you see **the park**?
13. Come out of the playing fields, turn right and walk along Greenhills Road, looking out for **Eastwood Town Cricket Club**.
14. Keep going, cross back over the road before reaching the main road.
15. When you reach Mansfield Road turn left, up the hill and look out for the old **Durban House**. What company is based there now? Do you know what they make?
16. Just above the old gates, take a cut through the park and look for a **memorial arch**. Can you find what year this was unveiled?
17. Turn right when through the arch and rejoin the main road. Carry on up until you see a **blue door**. How many squares with circles inside are on the door?
18. Turn left down Princes Street and you will see another **blue information panel**. What job did the people do who used to live in these houses?
19. Keep walking along, look out for **the cobbles**.
20. Keep walking along Princes Street until it meets with Wellington Street. Look up, can you see all the **outhouses** in the back gardens of the houses? What do they have on their roofs?
21. Note the **Millenium Clock** outside the library. Do you know when this was erected?
22. Turn right and walk to the first Zebra crossing. Carefully cross over and the Town Hall is in front of you. Can you find the **amazing artwork** on the left side of this building? What does it show?
23. Walk along the main road with the Town Hall on your left and you will see more **bright artwork**. How many flowers can you count?
24. As you walk, how many **silver Phoenix circles** can you see on the pavement beneath your feet? There are quite a few.
25. Keep walking until you get to Alexandra Street. Look across the Road. Can you see the **pub restaurant sign**? Why do you think it has this name?
26. Turn left and walk down Alexandra Street until you reach the junction with Church Walk.
27. Turn right and head through the jitty and you can see your final **destination** straight ahead.

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This walk will take you about 1 hour to walk at an easy pace of around 20 minutes per mile. It shows off different points of interest along the way, getting to know Eastwood.

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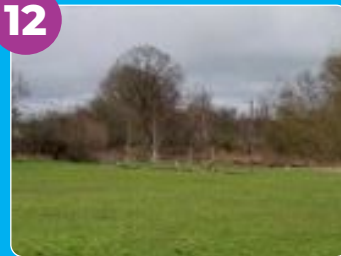
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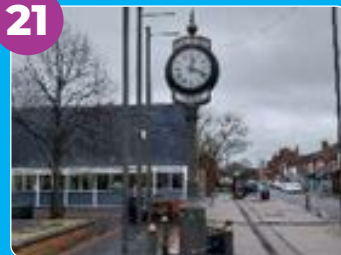
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
